January 14, 1925. LETTER.

Dear Dr. Ortega;

On behalf of the President of the University of Pennsylvania, I extend you an offer of a Fellowship under the auspices of the Neurosurgical Department, the duration of the Fellowship to be one year, to begin at such time as might be convenient for you to come, and the honorarium \$2500.

The material at your disposal would include all available specimens from the Neurosurgical Clinic of the University Hospital, directly under my control, and selection from a wealth of autopsy material (more than 300 neurological autopsies annually) available at the Municipal Hospital adjacent to the University Campus.

While you are in residence as a Fellow of the University, opportunity would be available, if desired, to give a limited number of hours of instruction to a limited number of graduate and undergraduate students.

We are most anxious to become familiar with the neuro-histological technic for which you and your School have obtained such distinction throughout the scientific world. It is for this purpose chiefly, and because of the firm belief in the advantages of the freest interchange of scientific ideas and personnel between civilized countries that this invitation is extended.
