NEUROPATHOLOGY

Dr. del Río Hortega has arrived from Paris and is making preparations to work temporarily in the Department of Human Anatomy. His niece, Senorita del Río, who has had some training in histological technique is anxious to work with him and he would like this.

He is at present collecting a list of the supplies and apparatus that he will need. He can use these temporarily in the Department of Human Anatomy and can take them with him to the Radcliffe Infirmary when the Cronshaw extensions are ready. The apparatus includes a microscope and a Sartorius freezing microtome.

I would like to propose to the Committee that Senorita del

Río be appointed a laboratory attendant, Grade II, at 3 Pound per week, and that a grant of 250 Pounds be made to cover the preliminary equipment for neuropathology.

Professor Le Gros Clark has kindly undertaken to handle the accounts for neuropathological equipment until Dr. del Río Hortega moves into the Cronshaw extension, if that meets with the approval of the Committee.
